Item No. 1 – Call the Meeting to Order

On behalf of President Gus Collins, Vice President Ethan Reimer called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m., which was held virtually via Microsoft Teams. A quorum was present.

Item No. 2 – Seek Approval for the Following Items:

- **January 28, 2026, Executive Committee Meeting Minutes**
 Nathan Law made a motion to approve the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on January 28, 2026. The motion was seconded by Tara Pierce and carried unanimously.
- **Appropriations Report for January 2026**
 On behalf of Mike Meyer, Brooke Kistler presented the Appropriations Report for January 2026. Jason Thrasher made a motion to approve the January 2026 Appropriations Report. Tara Pierce seconded the motion, and the motion was carried unanimously.

Item No. 3 – Gas Directors Report

Dixie Riedel provided updates on the Natural Gas Industry market. She shared that natural gas storage is currently below the five-year average after three large withdrawals took place on January 23, January 30, and February 6, 2026. The withdrawals were largely due to Winter Storm Fern in January, and Dixie discussed how gas pricing was impacted during this event. Dixie shared information on national pipeline projects completed in 2025 and noted that 85% of the new pipeline constructed last year was dedicated to transporting gas to LNG terminals in the Gulf for exporting. Dixie also mentioned that she received a call yesterday from Koch Energy’s new representative who was interested in getting more information about KMGA, and they plan to meet in-person at an upcoming Southern Star conference.

Item No. 4 – General Counsel Report

Terri Pemberton provided a brief update on the KCC. She reported that the Black Hills/KGS service territory docket is moving slowly due to both parties’ reluctance to share information. In the meantime, KMGA has been reaching out to member cities that could be potentially impacted by the territory dispute for discussion and to gather information so that KMGA will be as prepared as possible as the case moves forward.

Item No. 5 – General Manager Report

Paul Mahlberg reported that construction has begun on the new Mid-States facility in Salina and will include a large meeting space able to accommodate future Executive Committee meetings. It's estimated that construction on the new facility could be completed by March 2027.

Item No. 6 – Old Business

- **Natural Gas Prepay Update**

Paul Mahlberg shared that KMGa has been providing some additional documents to MMGA/Goldman Sachs as the prepay process gets closer to being finalized. MMGA/Goldman Sachs plans to release the preliminary official statement tomorrow and they'll then focus on getting pricing for the prepay. The market is currently favorable, and Paul said that KMGa may know what discount we'll be getting on the prepay within the next two to three weeks. MMGA/Goldman Sachs are targeting to close by the end of March.
